# **EXECUTIVE SUMMARY**

The AIIA Victoria inaugural Young Professionals Study Tour to Canberra 2023 marked a one of a kind journey for 15 successful tertiary students and early career professionals in international affairs based in Victoria. The immersive 6-day study tour provided unique insights into the political, international, cultural, and historical landscape of Australia's capital. It presented young professionals with exclusive opportunities for insightful discussions on a range of topics with some of the country's top foreign policy experts and practitioners, and offered an unparalleled opportunity for knowledge enrichment and networking. Such exposure allowed young professionals to build meaningful connections within the foreign policy landscape, fostering relationships that can shape their careers and open doors to new opportunities.

The Young Professionals Study Tour to Canberra included full access to the AlIA National Conference, Australia's leading annual event on Australian foreign policy. The AlIA 'Navigating the Perfect Storm: Australian Foreign Policy and the Polycrisis' National Conference hosted many distinguished guests who shape the nation's policies including ministers, academics, top government officials and industry leaders. The day brought together some of Australia's most prominent international affairs experts examining new developments in international affairs and the place of Australian foreign policy within them. The 15 Study Tour participants participated in careers-focused masterclasses on Multilateral Diplomacy, International Business, Universities and Think Tanks, and International Disaster Resilience at the Australian National University Coral Bell School the day before the AlIA National Conference. Following the masterclasses, the study tour cohort was invited to attend an evening reception at the Embassy of Japan.

After the AIIA National Conference, the study tour participants had exclusive bespoke access to the AIIA National President's Breakfast with the President of Latvia (2019–2023) Dr. Egils Levits, roundtable discussions at Parliament House, ANU National Security College, the Embassy of Spain, leading consultancy firms, the Office of the Special Investigator (OSI), and a private Federal Parliamentary Press Gallery tour.

The Young Professionals Study Tour to Canberra 2023 surpassed expectations, leaving a lasting impact on the young participants. By combining educational insights with experiential learning, the tour successfully achieved its objectives, creating a foundation for continued professional growth, collaboration, and engagement amongst the next generation of leaders in international affairs.

This report encapsulates the key experiences and the impact of the tour on the participants.



# **DAY 1: SAT 11 NOVEMBER**

#### MUSEUM OF AUSTRALIAN DEMOCRACY (MoAD)

Private Tour with a focus on International Affairs

The private tour offered the young professionals a chance to explore the history and evolution of democracy in Australia. Roundtable Discussion and Exclusive Tour of the CyberCX Security Operations Centre

CyberCX is the leading provider of professional cyber security and cloud services across Australia and New Zealand. With a workforce of 1,300 professionals, CyberCX helps customers confidently manage cyber risk, respond to incidents and build resilience in a complex and challenging environment. The study tour participants attended an interactive roundtable discussion with the CyberCX Lead Cyber Intelligence Analyst, a Senior Manager, a Senior Consultant, and the Protected Security Operations Centre (SOC) Analyst. Relevant international affairs events were discussed through the lens of cyber security. The discussion was followed by an exclusive private tour of the CyberCX Security Operations Centre (SOC).

#### **EMBASSY OF SPAIN**

Roundtable Discussion, Embassy Tour and Lunch

The young professionals were warmly welcomed at the Embassy of Spain, where they were greeted by the Ambassador HE Ms Alicia Moral Revilla and Chargé d'affaires Ms Momán Pampillo. The visit included an engaging roundtable discussion with the Ambassador, a tour of the embassy, and a paella lunch, fostering cultural exchange and diplomatic insights.







#### ANU NATIONAL SECURITY COLLEGE

Roundtable Discussion, Panel and Networking Reception

The day concluded with a visit to the Australian National University (ANU) National Security College. The participants had the valuable opportunity to discuss national security with Professor Rory Medcalf AM, Head of the National Security College. The discussion was followed by an insightful expert National Security Dissection Panel which enhanced their understanding of national security and fostered professional development. The visit culminated in a networking reception.

## **DAY 5: WED 15 NOVEMBER**

#### DFAT CLIMATE AND ENVIRONMENTAL DIPLOMACY BRANCH

Roundtable Discussion

On the fifth day of the study tour, the study tour participants actively participated in a roundtable discussion hosted by the Department of Foreign Affairs and Trade (DFAT) Climate and Environmental Diplomacy Branch. The participants gained firsthand knowledge of international efforts and strategies to address climate challenges.

#### **PARLIAMENT HOUSE**

Private Tour and House of Representatives Question Time

By attending a private tour, the participants discovered the must-see highlights within Parliament House from the towering flagpole to the Great Hall Tapestry, the architecture, the chambers of the Senate and House of Representatives, history and events. The tour was followed by seating during the House of Representatives Question Time and witnessing the Parliament in action.

# ROUNDTABLE DISCUSSION WITH SEN. JAMES PATERSON, SHADOW MINISTER FOR HOME AFFAIRS AND CYBER SECURITY

The participants then engaged in a conversation on pertinent issues within the realm of national security and cybersecurity with Sen. James Paterson, Shadow Minister for Home Affairs and Cyber Security, at Parliament House.



#### FEDERAL PARLIAMENTARY PRESS GALLERY

Private Tour with Stephen Dziedzic



The day ended with a Federal Parliamentary Press Gallery private tour led by Stephen Dziedzic, the ABC's Foreign Affairs (Asia Pacific) reporter, based in the Parliament House bureau. The tour offered unique insights into the workings of Australian federal politics and media relations. This immersive experience left a lasting impression on the participants, fostering a deeper appreciation for the critical role of the media.

# **DAY 6: THU 16 NOVEMBER**
